No reply, just silence. Thoughts flit through her mind. Perhaps it's a friend of ours passing by; maybe a caller with raffle tickets, possibly the meter reader ... maybe any one of fifty possible people ...

"Is that you, Kerry? (a neighbour)", she calls out. A voice replies, "No, it's Jake (another neighbour). "Have you seen our lost chicken, a brown one? It's not in the yard!"

Ha, Ha! Problem solved. We're safe to open the door. We knew our caller as soon as he spoke to us! And we've not seen the missing bird.

In searching for God, we can make guesses every single day of our lives as to what God is like – and never ever truly find an answer. Some think God is like a heavenly Santa Claus – there to shower us with gifts again and again. Another person thinks God is the 'getcha god' – who won't let you get away with anything pleasurable, but will 'getcha' in the end. Someone else thinks that God loves us – but then how do we account for all the trouble and hatred in the world? Beginning with ourselves and our own reason, we will never find God.

A professor once wrote to 250 of the then best known philosophers, scientists, writers and intellectuals in the world and asked each person "What is the meaning of life?"

Some offered their best guesses, some gave a 'made up purpose' and others said that honestly they were clueless. In fact, a number asked the professor to write back and tell them if he discovered the purpose for life! Now if the Creator & inventor of all did speak, *then* we could <u>truly</u> know about God & God's purposes for life.

When God speaks, do we listen?

"Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world." Hebrews 1:1-2

And God has chosen to speak!

God, the Designer and Creator of this vast universe of suns, space & planets, of amazing varieties of animals and plants, air and water – and humans – this God has chosen to speak.

God spoke directly to the first humans He created as male and female, and to the generations that



descended from them, but when He spoke to Moses He gave him a message for all humans. God not only gave him the Ten Commandments, but also told him to write down the record of God's dealings with mankind, for the benefit of future generations, including ourselves. The Bible says:

"And the Lord said to Moses, 'Write these words, for in accordance with these words, I have made a covenant with you and with all Israel" (Exodus 34:27).

Many sceptics say that God didn't say anything to Moses, that it was all imagined in Moses' head. Yet, if words mean anything (and they do) Moses declares that God spoke to him. Furthermore, God told Moses that He (God) was going to free the nation of Israel from slavery in Egypt, and God did as He said He would (see the book of Exodus in the Bible). The Bible shows God declaring the future again and again, then making these many, many promises happen. In fact, the words, 'God said' or 'the Lord said' are recorded over 3,000 times in the old section of the Bible – emphasising that these are not man's words or ideas, but they come from God. For this reason, the Bible is called 'God's Word'.

God spoke to Abraham and made promises, from which the whole Bible unfolds. Although Abraham was childless, he was promised a son and descendants too numerous to count, and that one of his descendants would bring 'blessing for all the world'.

The New Testament of the Bible identifies this person as Jesus Christ – God's final word to mankind. He came to begin to put an end to ungodliness and wickedness in the world. He brings a message of peace & pardon, of love & forgiveness from God for all who sincerely believe in Him. God has spoken, and He calls you to follow Jesus – as He re-shapes you and enlists you in His mission to speak to a lost and aching world. 'In believing God's word, we find the <u>true</u> meaning of life'. BT.

'Why Jesus?' Author: Nicky Gumbel.

The most important relationship a person can have is a relationship with God – writes Nicky Gumbel, evangelist and Bible teacher. He concludes that the reason for man's emptiness is that 'men and women have turned their backs on God'. Without this relationship, there will always be 'something missing in our lives'.

He then shows how the most amazing man who has ever lived — Jesus Christ — satisfies this hunger by providing *meaning and purpose in life*, satisfying our hunger for *forgiveness*, and replacing fear of our own certain death by freely *offering us the gift of eternal life*.

Gumbel states that people give excuses like "I have no need of God", "There is too much to give up", "There must be a trap", "I'm not good enough", "I could never keep it up" and "I'll do it later", as reasons for not accepting God's offer of pardon, and gift of the Holy Spirit to live within us. These excuses are answered and set aside by Gumbel so that people can see their way clear to respond to Jesus.

The initial response is to say <u>sorry</u> to Jesus for what we've done wrong, <u>thank you</u> to God for sending Jesus to die in our place on the cross, and <u>thank you</u> to Jesus for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

That's all that's required to start a genuine relationship with God, because Jesus has done it all for you. If you try to make a relationship with God without Jesus, then your sins won't have been forgiven, you won't know what it is to have peace with God, and you won't have assurance of eternal life. Do something about it today!
